

Below we outline persons who can certify a copy of a document as a "true copy of the original" that can be used for customer verification purposes in accordance with the *Anti-Money Laundering and Counter-Terrorism Financing Rules Instrument 2007 (No. 1)* ("AML/CTF Rules").

Certified copy means a document that has been certified as a true copy of an original document by one of the following persons:

- A PERSON who, under a law in force in a State or Territory, is currently licensed or registered to practice in an occupation listed in Part 1 of Schedule 2 of the Statutory Declarations Regulations 2018;
- A PERSON who is enrolled on the roll of the Supreme Court of a State or Territory, or the High Court of Australia, as a legal practitioner (however described);
- A PERSON who is listed in Part 2 of Schedule 2 of the Statutory Declarations Regulations 2018 presented on the next page;
- AN OFFICER with, or authorised representative of, a holder of an Australian Financial Services Licence, having two or more years of continuous service with one or more licensees;
- AN OFFICER with, or a credit representative of, a holder of an Australian credit licence, having two or more years of continuous service with one or more licensees;
- 6) IF OVERSEAS, A PERSON in a foreign country who is authorised by law in that jurisdiction to administer oaths or affirmations or to authenticate documents.
